




How long have you lived in this house? 8 yrs.

Ask around to get recommendations. If you see someone's landscaping that you like, ask them who did it or drive around new developments. More than likely you will see someone's yard being landscaped, take note of who is doing the work, and go back and check out the final outcome.

Being an active participant in your landscaping and making sure you are getting what you like are also important. Visit nurseries and ask questions about what you see and like. If you like a plant in a neighbor's yard, just ask them what it is. Also, don't let someone talk you into something you know you don't like. I recall telling our first landscaper that I did not want to see a certain plant in our yard, and he used it anyway! It was very frustrating working with him. Bottom line is be active in the process and enjoy the task. As for plants, my motto is "less is best."
